The system is not optimal—but right now, it's the best solution we could create to reach the following goals:

- To allow our patients and their caregivers to sit comfortably while waiting to be checked in. We do not want our patients who are sick, elderly or fragile to stand in line.
- To eliminate lines to enter our building that often caused the front doors to remain open and chill or heat up the fover.
- To eliminate confusion as to where the line begins, twists, turns and ends.
- To be compassionate and as efficient as possible to enable our patients to proceed to their appointment (s) as quickly as possible.

# Our Patients are Number One (continued)

A number of patients have commented that they don't like the new system and some feel offended by the numbers for various reasons. Many of these patients have been with our practice for years and didn't mind the old lines. We were very bothered by these comments, as we value our patients and want to provide the best experience possible. Through the years, we have received numerous complaints about the lines and the confusion that is caused when many patients enter simultaneously.

We decided to present our patients with a survey. We surveyed over 500 patients and the great majority—over 92% are fine with the numbering system. To improve our patient experience and streamline front desk operations further, we added the confidentiality screens and additionalstaff. We removed some of the tasks that the front desk staff needed to complete with our patients upon entry and moved those tasks to the second floor to make office visits flow more smoothly.

We have contemplated renovating the foyer to better meet the needs of our patient and staff and are still evaluating these possibilities. In summary—right now, we think this numbering system is our best option. We are grateful to our patients for allowing us to be an integral part of their healing journey and we appreciate your understanding and support of our practice operations. Please know that our patients are only NUMBER ONE!



# **Medicare's New Insurance Cards**

#### YOUR NEW CARD WILL LOOK LIKE THIS:

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
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Due to the Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act (MACRA), the removal of Social Security Numbers from all Medicare cards is required by April 2019.

A new Medicare Beneficiary Identifier (MBI) will replace the Social Security Number based Health Insurance Claim Number on the new Medicare cards. (Your new card will have a new Medicare Number that's unique to you, instead of your Social Security Number.)

This will help to protect your identity in the fight of medical identity theft.

You and your providers will be able to use the MBI for Medicare transactions like eligibility status, billing, and claim status. Once you receive your new Medicare card, please bring it with you to your next appointment we will make a copy that will be saved to your account.

Medicare has started to mail the new cards this April and will continue to do so in phases by geographic locations.
