Understanding your Blood Counts

When you're on chemotherapy or biological therapy (immunotherapy), your blood cells can be affected and can put you at higher risk for complications. This guide reviews some of the important types of blood cells that we monitor during your treatment, as well as extra precautions that you need to take if you're diagnosed with low blood counts.

White Blood Cells (WBC):

- ❖ WBC help fight infections
- ❖ Normal Range: 4 10
 - Granulocytes are a type of WBC that specifically help fight bacterial infections
 - ❖ Normal Range: 1.4 6.5

What is LEUKOPENIA / NEUTROPENIA?

- Leukopenia is a low white blood cell count
- ❖ Nuetropenia is a low granulocyte or neutrophil count
 - Also known as Absolute Neutrophil Count or ANC
 - Low ANC increases your risk for infection!

What should you do if you have a LOW ANC?

WASH YOUR HANDS FREQUENTLY ◊ Avoid people that are sick ◊ Avoid crowds

Symptoms to report to your HOA Doctor right away:

Fever ♦ Chills ♦ Cough ♦ Burning or pain with urination ♦ Wounds that aren't healing ♦ Redness or swelling ♦ Stiff neck ♦ Shortness of breath ♦ Sore throat ♦ Mouth sores

Hemoglobin & Hematocrit:

- ❖ Hemoglobin (Hgb) carries oxygen in the red blood cells
 - ❖ Normal Range: FEMALES 11.5 15.5; MALES 13.5 18
- ❖ Hematocrit (Hct) refers to the percentage of red blood cells in your blood
- ♦ Normal Range: FEMALES: 36 45; MALES 41 53

What should you do if you have ANEMIA?

Low Hgb or Hct

* Avoid vigorous physical activity & rest when fatigued

Change positions slowly (lying-to-sitting-to-standing)

Symptoms to report to your HOA Doctor right away:

Extreme fatigue \Diamond Heart palpitations \Diamond Chest pain \Diamond Shortness of breath \Diamond Headache \Diamond Dizziness

Platelets:

❖ Platelets help the blood clot if you're cut or bleeding; NORMAL RANGE: 150 – 400

What is THROMBOCYTOPENIA? What should you do if you have THROMBOCYTOPENIA?

Low platelets

❖ Try to avoid trauma; lessen the risk of bleeding/bruising

Avoid Aspirin (must discuss with your Doctor)

Symptoms to report to your HOA Doctor right away:

Excessive bruising \Diamond Petechiae (small red spots) \Diamond Bleeding (urine/stool/nose bleeds/bleeding gums)
